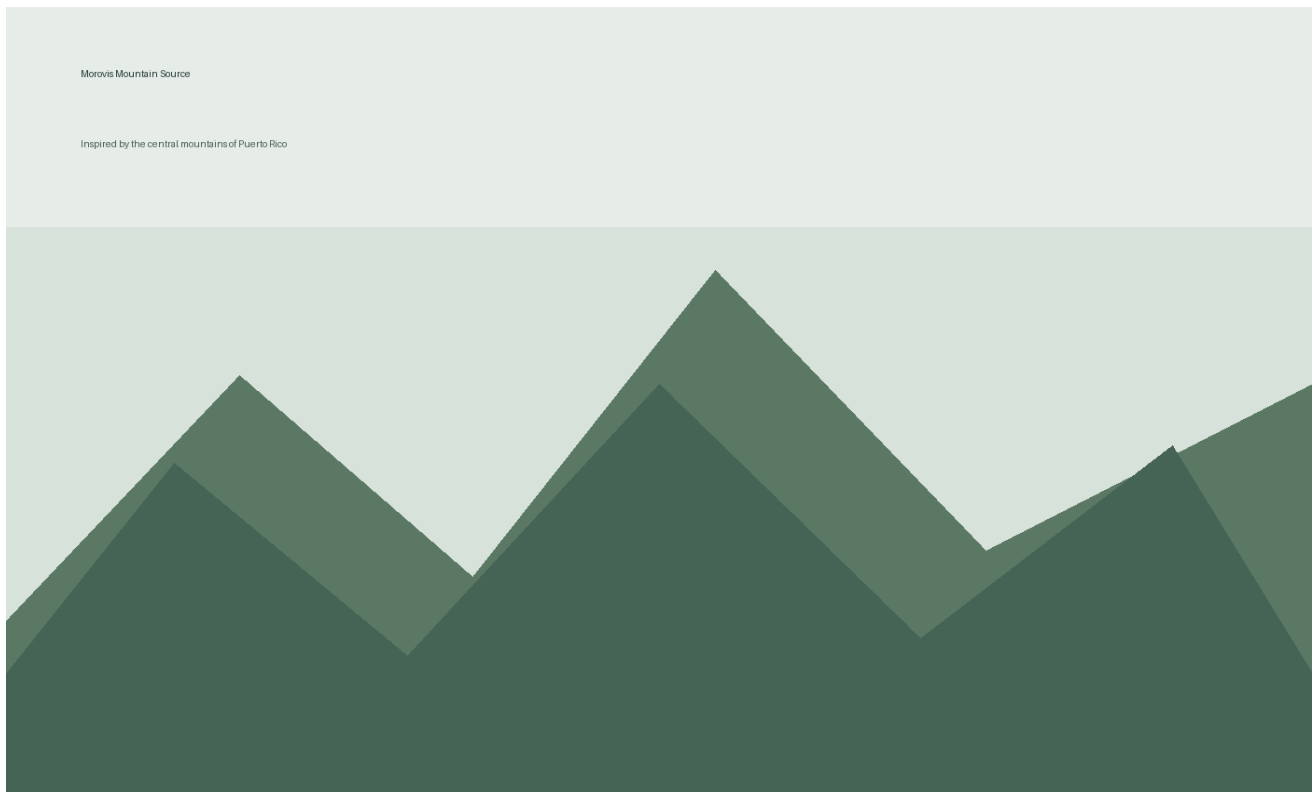

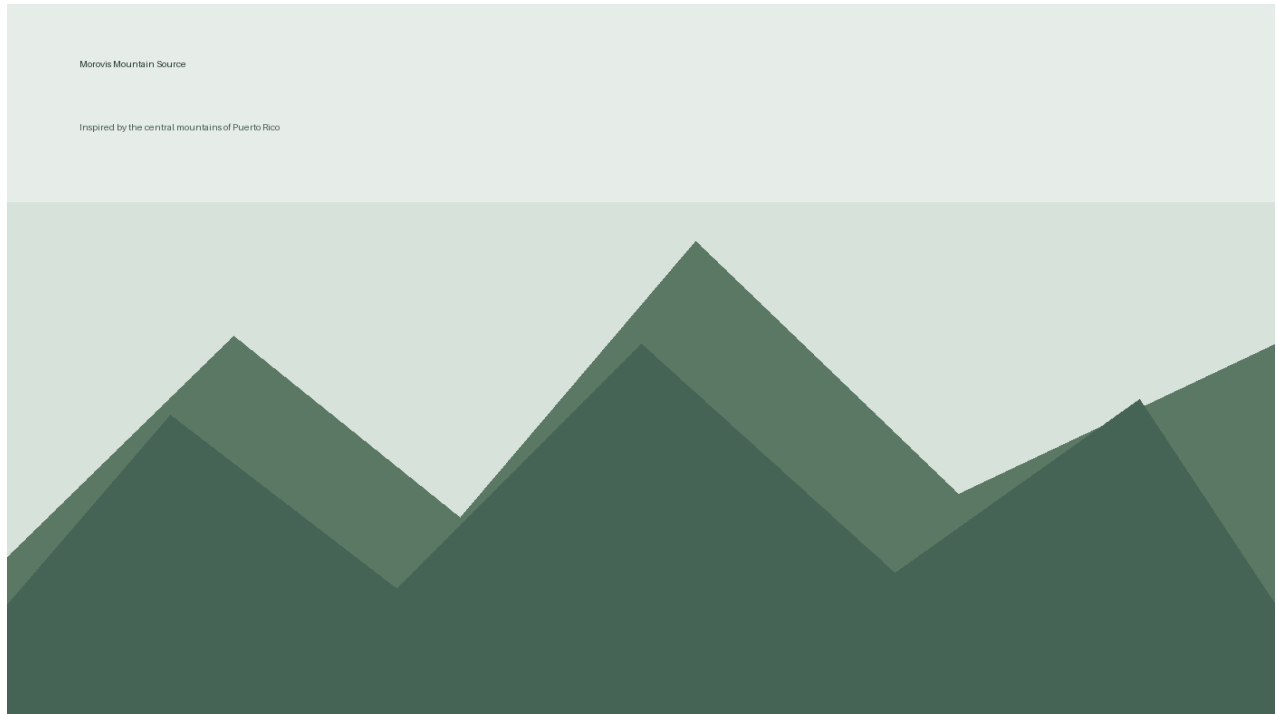


Why Water Matters

What Is Water, Really?

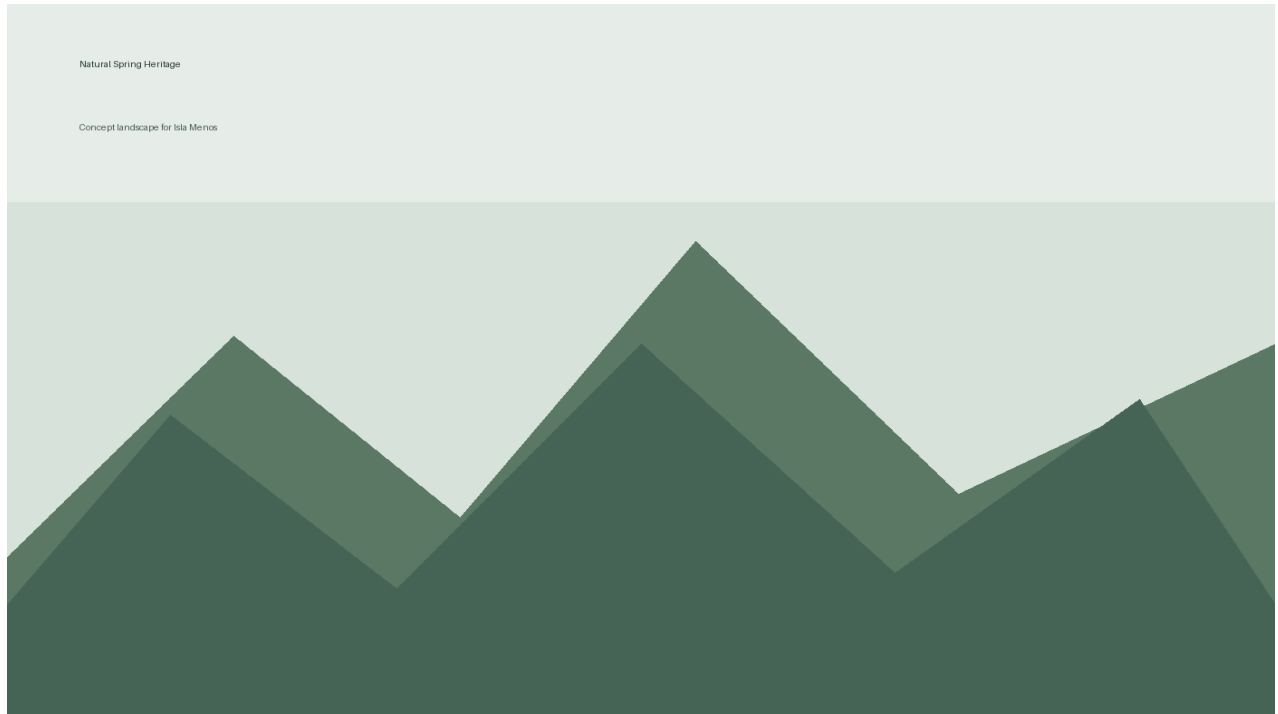

How Spring Water Is Born

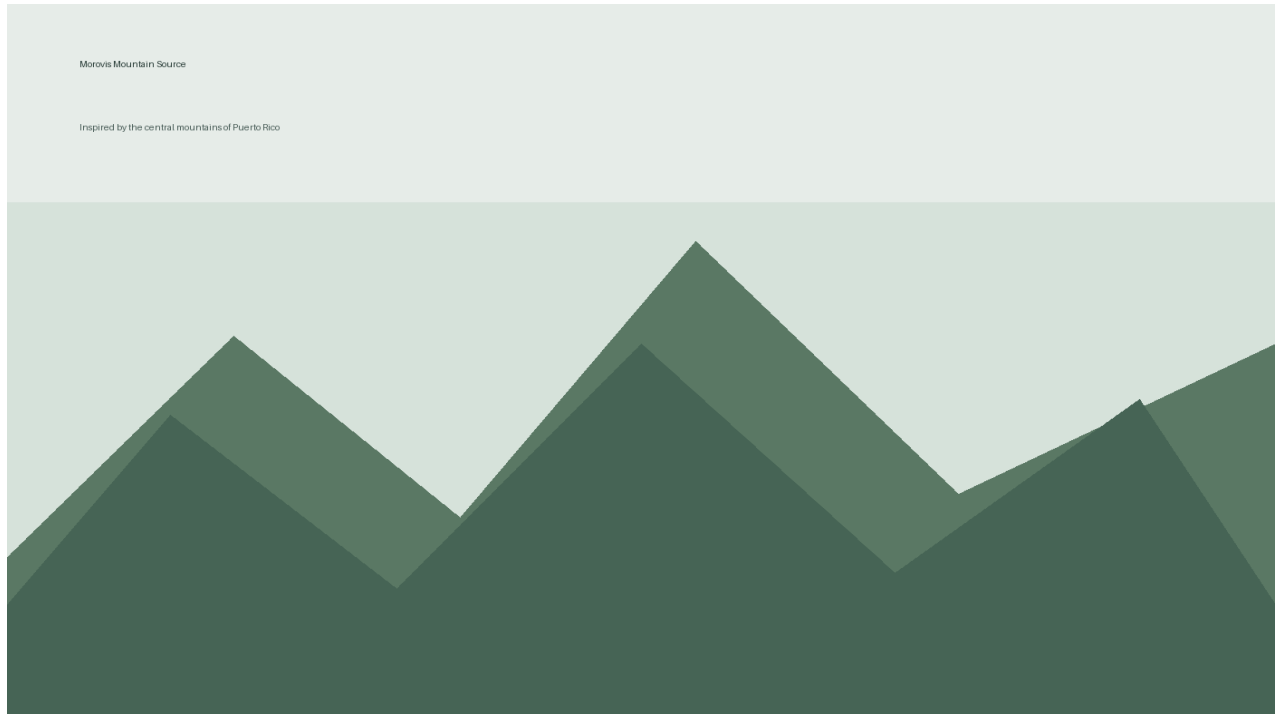
